

Knit a Sock in a Weekend - What to Bring

1. If you are used to working with small needles and skinny yarn and wish to do so for this class

- EITHER one long circular needle (at least 100cm / 40")
- OR two shorter ones (at least 60cm, 24") of the same needle gauge - they don't have to be the same length
- Yarn of a suitable size in a light color, 50g is plenty.

The circular needle(s) need to be the modern kind with the narrow, very flexible cord between them. The older stiff plastic cords will not do.

2. If you prefer to learn with larger needles and yarn so it's easier to see what you're doing

- EITHER one long circular needle (at least 100cm / 40", needle gauge 4-6mm)
- OR two circular needles of the same needle gauge (at least 60cm, 24" long, and 4-6mm gauge), not necessarily the same length
- Sport or double knitting weight yarn in a light color, about 50g.

If you choose to use two circular needles, you can use the older kind with the stiffer plastic cord, or the newer more flexible cord. To use one longer needle, you'll need the newer thin, flexible cord.

Great Balls of Wool on Marine Ave has the best local selection of needles and yarn. However, you may need to special-order the extra-long circular needle size.
